Vikarabad District was formed on 11.10.2016. The district is spread over an area of 3,386.00 square kilometres. The district shares boundaries with Sangareddy, Rangareddy, Narayanpet, Mahaboobnagar Districts and the state of Karnataka. As of 2011 Census of India, the district has a population of 927,140. Vikarabad District is formed with 19 mandals from erstwhile Rangareddy and Mahaboobnagar Districts and divided into 3 Revenue Divisions. Vikarabad Revenue Division formed with Marpalle, Mominpet, Nawabpet, Vikarabad, Pudur, Kulkacherla, Doma, Pargi, Dharur, Kotepally, Bantwaram mandals from Rangareddy District. Tandur Revenue Division formed with Basheerabad, Doulthabad, Tandur, Peddemul, Yelal mandals from Rangareddy District and Kodangal, Division comprising of Bommaraspet mandals from Mahaboobnagar District.

Tandur, the industrial town of this district has reputed cement industries due to availability of raw material minerals like Limestone, Shale and Laterite. Tandur is famous for Limestone and has about 600 micro stone polishing units, These stone units have created a brand name of its own as Tandur flooring stones. There are around 60 Mining units and 35 Bentonite mineral processing units.

Existing Industrial Estates:

Industrial Estate, Shivareddypet-Vikarabad: This is one of the old estates, established for setting up of general engineering units in the district. This estate comprises of 79 plots with total area of about 1 Lakh Square meters and 19 working units at present.

Industrial Park-Ramkamcherla-Pargi: This estate was established to shift the steel rerolling industries of Hyderabad. This estate comprises of 45 plots with total area of about 3 Lakhs square meters. 11 units have implemented in this estate and 33 plots are available for establishing new units in this estate.

Proposed Industrial Park-TG Food Processing Zone, Sy. No.32,12,Arkatala (V),Nawabpet (M): Land to an extent of 314 acres was taken possesion by TGIIC. As on date, 14 plots are developed and alloted to 9 Industrial units and Land agreement is in progress
